We were also delighted to welcome the 'Welsh Whisperer' for a day of lively and entertaining Welsh learning. Hailing from Cwmfelin Mynach in Carmarthenshire, his unique blend of comedy and culture brought the language to life and was thoroughly enjoyed by pupils and staff alike.


We had a day full of inspiration when the Welsh Whisperer visited us recently. He shared lots of
